Aspiro was founded in 1957 by 67 parents of children with disabilities, a groundbreaking achievement for the time. In an era when institutionalization was the norm and special education was not yet mandated, these parents defied societal expectations. By choosing to keep their children at home and creating programs and services themselves, they paved the way for a more inclusive future.

In the fall of 1956, a small article appeared in the Green Bay Press Gazette inviting parents of children with disabilities to meet in a room at the Court House building in Green Bay. After this meeting, there was sufficient interest to begin a local association and in June of 1957, the organization was incorporated. One of the first projects the new association took on was to host a public picnic. It raised \$2,100 which the organization used to provide support for special education classes.

Ten years later, construction began on the Community Service Center, now known as Aspiro. The Center was the first of its kind in the nation and provided a spectrum of care for 112 individuals that included diagnostic services, sheltered work, recreation, crafts, day care and pre- and post-school education.

Today, we continue to proudly share in their vision to provide the space and opportunities to have a happy, fulfilling life for their children. For almost 70 years, our dedication to their work has never wavered.

Now we launch *Beyond Expectations* and invite you to be part of our next 70 years.

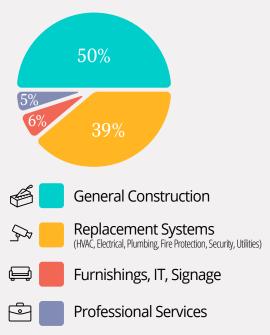

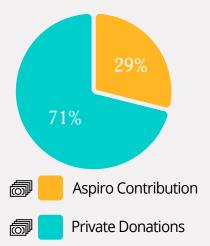
The *Beyond Expectations* campaign is a **\$21 million** fundraising campaign to upgrade an aging building and reimagine services for people with disabilities.

### A transformation Beyond Expectations.

Institutional designs from the 1960s were functional but impersonal. Modern, welcoming environments foster a sense of dignity and respect, connect people together and tailor spaces to the needs of those who use them. We invite you to be part of this effort.



### SPACES TO INSPIRE, TEACH AND EXPLORE

Classrooms with access to outdoor space – Lifelong learning helps individuals stay engaged and curious about the world around

engaged and curious about the world around them. Aspiro's programming reinforces previously learned skills and introduces new ideas and thinking. Natural light and direct access to outdoor spaces enhance learning.

**Art Studio** – A space that fosters natural expression at all abilities, and where clients develop self-awareness, explore emotions and improve social skills.

**Music Room** – Music captivates attention, motivates action and brings joy and success. It is a multi-sensory activity that combines the visual, kinesthetic, auditory and tactile systems. Additionally, music is non-verbal so for those who struggle with language, music can be a way to connect with others and express oneself.







**Teaching Kitchen** – The commercial space will be a mix of residential appliances for daily living skills development and some commercial equipment for job training.

**Gymnasium** – The gym has always been a signature space within Aspiro. It has been the hub for group sports, fitness and recreation. The new space will include an expanded spectator space to watch all the action and an adjacent weight room.

**Modern Nurses Station** – The nurses station will be updated for optimal client care.

Dementia-Friendly Space – A safe and familiar space for clients with a dementia diagnosis. A calm space with natural light and a simple, familiar layout.







### **RENOVATED SPACE THAT ENHANCES FUNCTIONALITY AND INSPIRES COLLABORATION**

How we serve clients has changed dramatically over the last 60 years. With hundreds of clients working in the community and others receiving Birth to 3 services in their homes, the new design will align the staff serving them to plan for their success.



### ADDRESSING THE NEEDS OF AN AGING BUILDING

Aspiro has diligently cared for an aging building for 57 years — leaking roofs, pipes filled with sediment and an electrical system whose manufacturer went out of business 40 years ago. We have replaced boilers and air conditioning units, and put band-aids on things, but now is the time to address a building with systems that are beyond their life expectancy.

### Renovated spaces will include:

1 Reception – Every day, hundreds of clients arrive through the doors at Aspiro for various programs. We take pride in providing what we call our Red Carpet Service as Aspiro staff assist clients with exiting their vehicles and entering the building. This space says, "Welcome to Aspiro!"

**2 Commons** – The Commons is at the center of social interaction at Aspiro. It is the gathering space for lunch with daily conversations and laughs with friends, group activities and the serving space for large celebrations like holiday parties and family night.

**3 Gymnasium** – The gym is unique to Aspiro and is at the core of our expansive sports, fitness and recreation programming. It hosts organized league sports like basketball and volleyball, pick-up kickball games, walking and exercise programs, and so much more. It would not be Aspiro without this signature space.

4 Art Studio – This space transcends beyond arts and crafts. A licensed art therapist engages clients with a diverse range of materials and techniques, fostering freedom of expression and introducing them to new experiences.

### Michael's story: Living a life no one expected

Once he graduated from high school, there was nowhere for Michael Kallies to go. Nothing for him to do except spend every day at home.

Jon and Krissy, Michael's parents, made the difficult decision for Jon to quit his job so he could be with Michael, who is diagnosed with fragile X syndrome and autism. But it wasn't enough.

"Michael likes to be part of something," said Jon. "He likes to do different things every day." Spending all day at home, he was bored and frustrated. "He would get angry and slam doors. He just wasn't himself."

### **NEVER A BAD DAY**

Where they lived in Antigo, there wasn't any programming or resources for people with special needs. Michael needed a long-term solution so Jon and Krissy searched throughout central and northeastern Wisconsin until they found Aspiro.

They quickly enrolled Michael in Aspiro's Day Services and his life changed on the first day.

Every day is different for Michael, according to Jon. "Sometimes he goes on an outing and does a workout. Some days he wants to go to an art class or a music class," he said. Michael has a group of friends he gets to see every day, and he can choose what he wants to do.

"He never has a bad day. He's thriving, and he loves it."

#### A SENSE OF COMFORT

As much as Aspiro has done for Michael, Jon says it's been equally important for him and Krissy.

"Michael's a really good kid. He did well in school, then when he graduated everything came to a sudden stop," he recalled. He added that Aspiro has given their son a sense of purpose and belonging, and it's given him and Krissy a sense of comfort knowing their son is safe and thriving.

"It has meant the world to Michael," he said. "I don't know what we would do without Aspiro."

## **Employees who exceed expectations**

Darin Duvall was worried when he hired his first Aspiro client. But the experience exceeded his expectations.

"I was worried about how they would feel being there," said Duvall, executive director of the New Perspective senior living community in Howard. "The biggest surprise was to see how happy they are to be giving back and to be working, earning money and finding their place."

But the surprises didn't stop there.

Duvall added that his employees from Aspiro have made a tremendous impact on the rest of his staff and the residents at New Perspective.

"They come in to work every day, they're happy, they're smiling," he said. "The

residents love them. The other team members love them. They're just great for morale."

The best part of hiring employees through Aspiro, according to Duvall, is the contagious sense of pride they feel from putting in a good day's work. "They feel like they're part of something, that they're productive and can earn some money," he said. "They can be like everybody else."

Duvall encourages all business owners in Brown County to consider hiring employees through Aspiro. "If you list all of the things that you want from an ideal employee – showing up, doing a good job, having a positive attitude – they nail all of them. You can teach someone a skill set, but you can't teach them to care. Aspiro employees care about their work and each other."

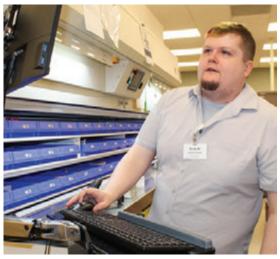
