Positive Parenting is a home visitation program that helps families headed by parents with intellectual disabilities meet the multifaceted task of being a parent. The goals of the program are to promote healthy parent-child interactions, encourage optimal child health, growth and development, promote safety in the home and community, and link families to community services.

Program Services

Positive Parenting provides individualized and intensive services for eligible families including:

- Assistance with basic needs such as food, housing, clothing and transportation
- Linking families to physicians and other health providers
- Child Development Screening and Education
- Nutritional Screening and Education
- Parenting Education
- Home Management Education
- Information and Referral
- Social/Recreational Opportunities
- Case Management
