RE: COVID-19 Vaccination and masking at ASPIRO

We were delighted to hear Dr. Walensky, the director of the CDC, announce that “Anyone who is fully vaccinated can participate in indoor and outdoor activities, large or small, without wearing a mask or physical distancing.”

At this time, our masking policy has not changed, but we are reviewing the guidance and will be working to alter our programming accordingly.

Since masking at ASPIRO will likely become contingent on vaccination, we would like to begin collecting copies of COVID 19 Vaccination Record cards or other evidence of Covid-19 immunization (e.g. a print out from [My Chart](#) or the [Wisconsin Immunization Registry](#)).

As you know, since the beginning of the pandemic all guidance has been a moving target. We have moved swiftly to react to new guidance as it is released. Unfortunately, that sometimes creates a lot of work that quickly becomes unnecessary. Over the past weeks we have asked for immunization dates. That was based upon guidance related to immunization and quarantine. I’m sorry that we have to reach out again, so soon after that request, to ask for more information but even if you have shared your date of vaccination this new guidance requires us to collect your vaccination record. Thank you for your time and attention.

Safest		Walk, run, wheelchair roll, or bike outdoors with members of your household

Less Safe		Dine at an outdoor restaurant with friends from multiple households	
Least Safe		Attend a crowded, outdoor event, like a live performance, parade, or sports event

Less Safe		Visit a barber or hair salon	
		Go to an uncrowded, indoor shopping center or museum	
		Attend a small, indoor gathering of fully vaccinated and unvaccinated people from multiple households	
Least Safe		Go to an indoor movie theater
